Our Lady of Peace BLOOD PROGRAM



STAFF IN THE SPOTLIGHT

My name is Diane Corson and I am OLP's new IT Coordinator. I am so happy and excited to be here to help our parents, students and staff with all of our Technology needs. I have been around OLP for many years now, as I have three kids who attend OLP – Grace in 8th grade, Katie in 6th grade and RJ in 3rd grade.

I have been involved in our school in many capacities over the past 9 years including School Board, lunch duty, safety patrol, Room Mom, chairing Dining Out for HSA, Chairing Cookies with Santa, helping with the Decorating Committee for the Auction and probably a few more things that I am forgetting about!!!

Many of you know me as a fellow Mom, but were surprised to hear that I was taking on the Technology role at OLP. Before becoming a Mom, I graduated from DePaul University with a BA in Communications and a minor in Law. From there I went on to work for a consulting firm where I expanded my education to include networking design and programming. I worked for firms such as Sanwa Business Credit Corp, American Family Insurance and Bank One (now known as Chase Bank); advising on networking infrastructure changes, programming system changes and managing large projects. From there I was hired by Bank One to complete Corporate IT Audits and later to implement Corporate Credit Card programs for our large and mid-sized customers on the East Coast. When my oldest was 6 months old, it was clear that the travel involved in my position was getting a little out of control and that I had a much more important "job" to fulfill right at home, so I was blessed to be able to make the choice to stay home. My husband Rob and I live in Darien and have for the past 13 years. We are strong supporters of Catholic education (as evidenced by the fact that I went to Catholic school from Pre-school through college!.)

I am looking forward to working with our parents, staff, students, and vendors to make our Technology program the best it can be.

REGISTRATION

Registration is now underway for the 2017-2018 school year. Current school families can register through School Speak. Families that are interested in registering their child(ren) for the first time can register in the school office.

STUDENT TRANSFER GRANT

Our school offers a \$1,000 grant the first year to any child (1st-7th grade) that transfers into our school. The child will receive a \$500 grant in his/her second year. Besides the grade level restriction, the only other restriction is that the child is not transferring from a school in the Chicago Archdiocese or the Rockford or Joliet Diocese. Please contact the school office if you have any questions about this grant.

TUITION ASSISTANCE

As we begin the registration process for the coming school year, I want to let current and future parents know that there are a couple of ways you can receive tuition assistance. The Catholic Education Foundation (CEF) gives thousands of dollars of tuition assistance to students in schools all across the Diocese of Joliet. This past school year, our school had the most students receive tuition assistance that we ever had. We had 13 children received tuition assistance for a total of \$9,100 this school year. If there is a need by a family, CEF wants to help each child go to a Catholic school.

Not only do our students receive tuition assistance from CEF, but they also receive help from our parish as well. This school year, our parish has assisted families with \$19,218 through matching tuition grants and other help.



Illinois House Bill 40

February 13, 2017

Brothers and Sisters,

One of the noblest forms of witness that we Catholics give in our contemporary society is to stand up for the dignity of human beings as children of God. We feel a special commitment to the most vulnerable and the most innocent of all: children in the womb.

Of course, unborn children depend primarily upon the care of their mothers. But legal protection is also important, something that has been lacking in the United States for over forty-four years.

A bill has been introduced in the Illinois legislature—House Bill 40—which has two destructive purposes:

- (I) to thwart any future decision by the U.S. Supreme Court to reverse or limit Roe vs. Wade; and
- (2) to allow for the use of public money to fund the taking of innocent human lives through abortion in the state's Medicaid and health insurance programs.

It is essential that people who believe in the protection of human life in the womb contact their proper state legislators and express their **opposition** to House Bill 40. You can find your state legislators by visiting www.ilcatholic.org and clicking on 'Find Your Legislator' or by calling the Catholic Conference at 312-368-1066 or 217-528-9200 and asking for help.
