Parish News!

Over the past 10 months or so, you parishioners of Our Lady of Peace have gotten used to seeing a variety of Marian Father priests coming and going. As I count them, there have been at least 8 different Marian priests who have visited OLOP to help Fr. Walter attend to the sacramental needs of the parish. Fr. Walter has affectionately referred to this rotation of Marians as the 'priest of the week.' I, myself, have had the privilege of being a part of this cycle, having spent a total of about 5 weeks offering my assistance on behalf of the spiritual needs of the good people of Our Lady of Peace.

Now, you see, I am back again. This time, however, there is a difference; I am here to stay! Yes, I have officially been assigned to Our Lady of Peace as the associate Pastor to Fr. Walter and I am pretty stoked about it. 'Stoked?' Some of you may be wondering what exactly that means. It's basically an informal way to say that I am really excited to have been assigned to minister at this parish. So, why am I 'stoked'? Well, there are many reasons. One, for instance, is that after being a priest for 14 1/2 years, I finally get to be in full time ministry. You may be asking yourself what exactly I mean by that? Have I only been a part time priest or something during my initial 14 1/2 years? Well, no, not exactly. The first two years of my priesthood I spent at our formation house in Steubenville, OH working with vocations and helping on the campus of Franciscan University. The next 12 1/2 years I spent at our house of formation in Washington, DC serving various capacities: as the superior of the house of formation; as a Novice Master to help form men in the initial stages of their Marian religious life and finally as the director of the seminary formation program. While that ministry was good and necessary for my community, I still felt this urge to be out with the people. A few times a year I would partake in a Divine Mercy mission or retreat, this would always awaken that desire to be out with the people. Thus, when the need for another priest at OLOP came about I jumped at the chance to live out amongst the 'sheep.' This leads me to another reason for being enthusiastic about my assignment to OLOP, that is the opportunity that this parish affords for doing something great for God. During the 5 weeks I spent serving here, I experienced that there is a lot of talent and good will for wanting to make this parish excel even more with the greater glory of God. I look forward to working with you wonderful people to make God's goodness even more manifest in all of our hearts.

So what will my role be here at OLOP? Well, in simple terms I am going to be the new pastor in training. Fr. Walter's time with us will be ending around May as he returns to reside and help out with the ministerial needs at the National Shrine of the Divine Mercy. This means I will be involved in all sorts of things. Besides attending to the normal sacramental duties, I will be overseeing the Finance and Parish Councils. Fr. Walter has also given me the primary responsibility of serving as the chaplain of the school as well as the Director of Religious Education. In addition to these two responsibilities, I will also be teaching 7th grade religion two times per week. Both of these ministries suits my interests as I have a passion for learning, mainly theology and other subjects, especially when seen in the light of the truth about God. I also have a zeal for Catholic education after benefiting from it myself at a quality Catholic high school (St. Xavier) and grade school (St. Gabriel) in Louis-ville, KY.

That's about it, folks. I really look forward to being with you. I do ask just one small favor...that all of you White Sox, Cubs, Bears, Bulls, and Blackhawks fans will forgive me if I bring a little DC sports love with me. After growing up in a college sport town, you can't blame me for picking up an affection for all things Washington, especially after living there for 17 of the past 19 years.



Our blood is the life line of our families, community and that of the world. To this day, research done by man has not been able to manufacture it. Blood is purely and simply a human resource, given by one human being for another person in need. Each day of every year blood centers are faced with the challenge of collecting enough blood to meet the region's blood supply demands. It's a difficult task on an average day, but even more during the summer and holiday seasons. Accidents, illness and injuries know no age, race, sex, religion or social status.

They certainly do not recognize the lazy hazy days of summer or activities at holiday time. The lack of blood during theses times may result in insufficient blood for patient care in our community.

You can help prevent the shortage of blood by donating a pint of your blood on Saturday, July 21st between 8:30 AM and 2:30 PM here at Our Lady of Peace in the School Gym. Last year we collected only 29 pints of blood. Our goal last year was 50 pints. We fell short but I know we can make a goal of 50 pints if everyone who is eligible shows up this year.

Any healthy adult age 17 or older who weighs at least 110 lbs. can donate their blood. It will take you approximately 1 hour. Remember to bring a photo ID with you that day and eat something.

Imagine this scene:

Our day starts with a buffet breakfast at 7:00am in the outside area of the hotel. After o short walk to the provincial hospital we celebrate Mass. The hospital doesn't have a chapel so we celebrate Mass in the gathering area of two hallways. People from all over the hospital come and join us. After Moss each of the mission teams break off to their daily task; surgery, construction, dental, and outreach with one of the many schools and villages surrounding Borongan, Philippines.

Can you see this image in your mind? Does it stir something in your heart? Is there something in your gut wanting to be part of the scene? The Spirit may be calling you to mission. The Office for Human Dignity- Partnership In Mission is pleased to announce the next formation of the medical/construction/outreach mission team to Borongan, Philippines. The mission goes to serve one of the poorest areas of the Philippines on the island of Samar. This mission will leave on January 25th and return February 9th, 2019.

The medical team needs the following: General, Plastic, ENT, Orthopedic, and Pediatric surgeons. We also need six persons to administer anesthesia (MD's and CRNA's) as well as operating and recovery rooms nurses. There is also a great need for Staff Nurses, especially Filipino. The ability to teach is a super plus.

In addition we are looking for Pediatricians and/or Pediatric Nurse Practitioners, Family Practitioners, Internists, ER doctors, and Dentists.

We are also looking for men and women who would like to partner with local families to build homes and work in the outreach programs for the poor in the villages around Borongan. No special construction skills are needed, just willing hands and warm hearts.

In addition to the people we need, we also ask for your prayers. Gifts of surgical supplies will be greatly appreciated. Please contact the office with a list of supplies you have to donate.


Catholic Charities' Back to School Fair



Fr. Michael Caruso, SJ is President of St. Ignatius College Prep in Chicago. He has served as the Chair of the Department of Educational Leadership at Loyola Marymount University in Los Angeles and was an Associate Professor of Education with an emphasis in Catholic Administration. He has written on Catholic school leadership, spirituality in education and the historic foundations of Catholic education and has worked extensively in forming Catholic elementary and high school teachers and administrators in the Diocese of Orange and the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, one of the most diverse Catholic school systems in the U.S.

Fr. Caruso earned his B.A. from Conception Seminary College in Missouri and his M.Div./S.T.B. from St. Mary of the Lake University in Mundelein, IL. He was ordained for the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph in Missouri and later entered the Jesuits. Subsequently, he earned his Doctorate [Ed.D.] from the University of San Francisco at the Institute of Catholic Educational Leadership.

Fr. Caruso taught at both DeSmet Jesuit High School in St. Louis and Regis Jesuit High School in Denver. He also has worked in campus ministry at Rockhurst Jesuit University in Kansas City. He has published numerous articles on Catholic education in the United States as well as a book: *When the Sisters Said Farewell: The Transition of Leadership in Catholic Elementary Schools.* In 2017 he delivered the *Tre Ore* reflections for the Seven Last Words of Christ at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City.
