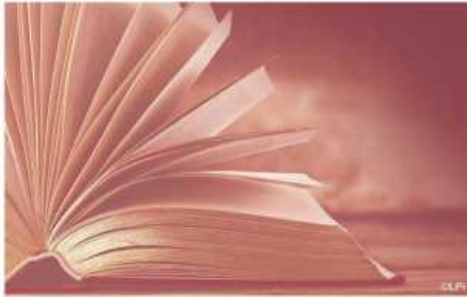

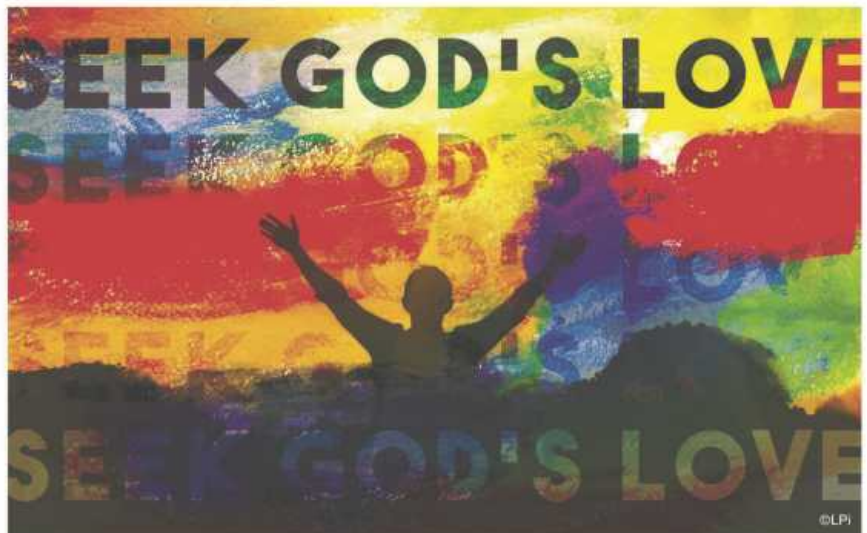

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

What virtue is the cornerstone of discipleship? Love. Jesus preached about it, lived it, and summarized his greatest commandment featuring it. Love is in our DNA. To follow Jesus, then, is to follow the path of love. While this may appear to be an attractive and easy option, it most assuredly is not. Authentic love always comes with sacrifice. It is the complete giving of oneself to another. The sacrificial character of love always requires that we leave something aside and pursue something else. This is at the heart of self-denial. Love asks us to make choices that are often difficult.

There is a reason Jesus asks that the love of God come first. "Charity is the right attitude of mind which prefers nothing to the knowledge of God. If a man possesses any strong attachment to the things of this earth, he cannot possess true charity (St. Maximus the Confessor)." "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." A devoted disciple must be single-minded in her quest for God. She cannot allow anyone or anything to have more power over her soul than God. When any earthly attachments become more important than Love, we can get ourselves into trouble.

The Gospel calls us to walk boldly into the darkness, confusion, and emptiness of the world clothed in the mantle of love. We are asked to walk with others on their journey, offering a supportive, healing, challenging, and faithful presence. Ours is not to judge. To walk this sacrificial journey means that I must put myself aside and focus on the needs of others. "A sacrifice to be real must cost, must hurt and must empty ourselves (St. Teresa of Calcutta)." Love helps us walk straight and focus to see things more clearly and help others to do so as well. Many folks struggle to find joy and meaning in life. People may simply need someone with the freedom to sit with them in their pain, so they don't feel so alone. Through acts of kindness, gestures of acceptance, and words of compassion, burdens can be lightened. Believe in God's love and seek it above all other things!

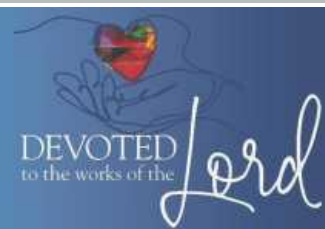

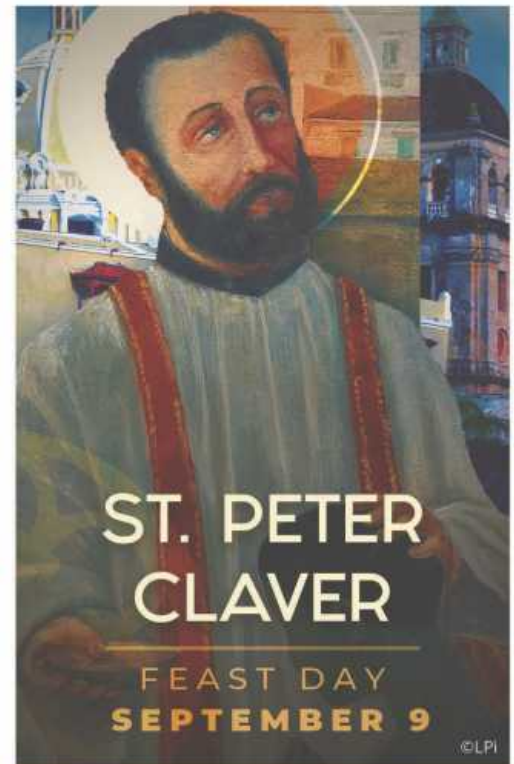

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Born in Catalonia Spain in 1580, Saint Peter Claver studied at first at the University of Barcelona and then joined the Jesuits. He became friends with fellow brother Saint Alphonsus Rodriguez who encouraged him to be a missionary in the New World. Accordingly, Saint Peter went to Cartagena, a city in present-day Columbia where he was ordained in 1615.

Cartagena was a center for the slave trade, and the young missionary knew where he could best serve God. He proclaimed himself, "the slave of the Negroes forever." As ships would arrive with their human cargo, Saint Peter and a group of interpreters would rush into the hold with food and medicines. When the slaves were moved to pens to await sale, the saint continued to work among them, communicating God's love with acts of generosity and teaching the Catholic faith.

He also led missions in the interior, refusing the hospitality of plantation owners and preferring to stay in the slave quarters. He organized charitable societies and is said to have baptized and catechized more than 300,000 enslaved persons.

Saint Peter Claver died on September 8, 1654. He was canonized with his friend Saint Alphonsus Rodriguez in 1888, by Pope Leo XIII. He is the worldwide patron saint of African Americans and of enslaved peoples.

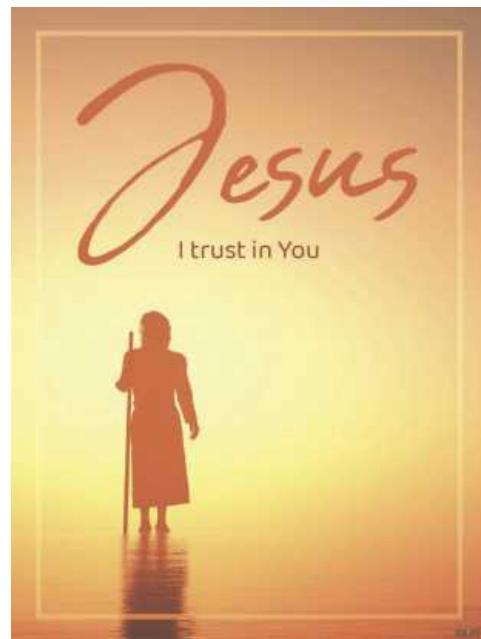

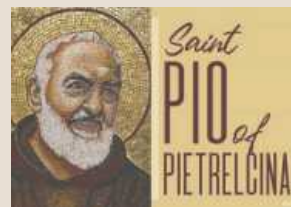

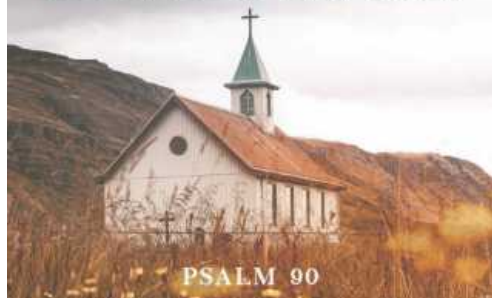

Ertha Papillon has an inspiring story to tell. For the past 25 years she has dedicated her life to serving the poorest of the poor in the countryside near the small village of Duchity, Haiti. As the founder and director of an orphanage and an elementary school in the mountains of southwest Haiti and as a leader in the faith community of Ste. Marie-Madeleine Parish, Ertha labors intensely to help countless people who endure both the sufferings of extreme poverty as well as the damaging effects of the earthquake and hurricane that ravaged parts of her country over the past 12 years.

On the weekend of September 10-11, Ertha will be visiting Our Lady of Peace to share at all the Masses about what God has been accomplishing through her charitable outreach since she last visited our faith community back in August 2017. Many positive things have happened in Haiti over the last five years but the struggles of serving in one of the poorest countries on earth remain the same.

To that end, a collection will be taken during each Mass that weekend to benefit Ertha's orphanage and school. If you are not able to attend Mass that weekend but would still like to make a donation, checks can be written to "Our Lady of Peace" with "Haiti-Ertha" in the memo and sent in the mail or dropped off at the church.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

CATECHUMENATE: The process of a determined period of time, in which the Church helps those unbaptized adults prepare for the Sacrament of Christian Initiation.

ELECTION: The process of selecting those catechumens who are ready to take part in the celebration of the Sacrament of Initiation.

GODPARENTS: The person(s) selected by the candidate (catechumen) to accompany him/her during the Rite of Initiation.

SPONSORS: Those persons chosen to accompany the candidates when they seek admission to the catechumenate and remain with the candidates to oversee their progress. (Sponsors may also be chosen as godparents).

CHRISTIAN SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION: Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation are the Sacraments of Initiation into the Catholic Church. The Catholic Church does not re-baptize Christians. Adults already baptized in another Christian Church are simply asked to make a Profession of Faith, are Confirmed and receive the Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.

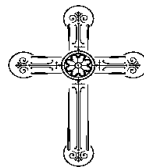
