

Dear Parishioners:

September 13, 2021

We are sharing with you the parish's financial statements for the fiscal years ended June 30, 2021, and 2020. We have also included the fiscal year 2021-22 budget.

We know this year was challenging for us all, and we truly appreciate the continued support you provide to your parish community. The impact of suspending all masses due to the COVID-19 pandemic, followed by capacity restrictions for the number of parishioners who could attend mass, is reflected in a 13% decline in Sunday offerings. Again, we were blessed by a generous parishioner who gifted us a \$43,000 unrestricted bequest in her will. Expenses for the church rose 16%, mainly reflecting \$135,000 of costs to maintain and operate the school building. In previous years, these costs were included in the school report. Partially offsetting these expenses were lower parish and religious education payroll costs and capital expenditures.

Fr. Mark and a parish planning committee (PPC) continue to work with the Bishop and DOJ Buildings and Properties Committee on the future of the school campus and how it can be utilized to meet the needs of the parish community. Additional information will be communicated regarding these plans in late 2021.

In response to the pandemic and its negative impact on the economy, the CARES Act was passed by Congress and signed into law. Part of the Act was the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP). The \$659 billion funded under the Small Business Administration's (SBA) Business Loans Program Account was intended to provide loans to entities to guarantee payroll and other costs to help those entities remain viable and allow employees to continue to earn a paycheck. During FY 19-20, Our Lady of Peace applied for and was granted a PPP loan of \$307,000. Per the loan terms, we utilized these funds to keep all school, parish, and religious education staff on the payroll with full salaries and benefits. A portion was also used to cover our campus utility bills. In addition, the loan is forgivable if certain conditions are met, and, in August 2021, we received word that our loan was 100% forgiven by the SBA.

The school roof replacement project planned for the summer of 2020 was completed and came in under budget. The roof project was funded by cash in our Diocesan Deposit account and was part of our twelve-year campus facility plan. Partially offsetting this project was a generous bequest by a parishioner. The five-year capital campaign for replacing the parking lot has been completed as of June 2021, with all remaining pledges paid in full. We again thank you for your continued generosity to your parish.

Parishioners remain very generous in their response to second collections, as \$27,000 was contributed for special diocesan intentions, and another \$112,000 was collected for the parish's food pantry ministry. The food pantry experienced a record year in donations, and we want to acknowledge the generosity of the parish community. In addition, the parish's Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal (CMAA) remained a very successful endeavor, as the parish realized \$51,000 in rebates from the annual appeal due to the parish once again exceeding its diocesan goal. Overall, the parish is in a healthy financial position due to the support of parishioners and proper financial management of the parish assets.

Communication is key to an active and successful parish. We will keep you informed of the parish's financial standing, and we encourage you to visit our website at www.olopdarien.org to stay apprised of the happenings within our ministries.
