We are sharing the Parish financial statements for fiscal years ended June 30, 2023, and 2022, along with the 2023-24 budget. Please take time to read the report to better understand the financial position of our parish.

We truly appreciate your continued generosity and support to our parish community. Overall, revenues increased from last year by 6%, with Sunday offerings rising 4%. Certain one-time revenues were recognized both in this fiscal year and last year. In fiscal year 22-23, we received a \$310,000 unrestricted bequest from Phyllis Barraia that we directed to the capital campaign. The parish applied for and received a \$89,700 refundable tax credit under the Employee Retention Credit Act. Partially offsetting these items in fiscal 21-22 was the forgiveness of the \$307,000 loan we had received under the Paycheck Protection Program. Expenses for the church rose 4%, reflecting expenditures related to the renovation of the church hall, including the purchase of flooring, cabinets, chairs, live streaming audio-video equipment, security system upgrades, and rectory improvements.

This July, we launched our parish center capital campaign, "Continuing A Legacy of Faith," seeking to raise \$2,000,000 to fund these exciting renovations to serve our parish community. The project's scope includes:

A modern new parish center exterior New lobby reception area

Private meeting-dining room

Parish Center event space Catering service area

Three accessible washrooms

The original boilers and air handlers in the school building will be replaced with a new energy efficient system, using current funds from our parish savings account, held at the Diocese.

The parish's overall cash position improved by \$463,000 from the previous year due to prudent management of our expenses and the \$310,000 bequest previously noted. We incurred \$24,000 of costs for the church hall renovation during the year and engineering and architectural fees for the church, church hall, and parish center renovations.

Parishioners remain generous in their response to second collections, as \$50,000 was contributed for special diocesan intentions, and \$96,000 was donated to our food pantry ministry. In addition, our Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal (CMAA) remained a successful endeavor, as the parish realized \$56,000 in rebates from the annual appeal due to the parish again exceeding its diocesan goal. Overall, the parish is in a healthy financial position due to the support of parishioners and proper fiscal management of the parish assets.

Communication is vital to an active and successful parish. We will continue to inform you of the parish's financial standing and encourage you to visit our new website at www.olopdarien.org to stay apprised of the happenings within our ministries.
