We are sharing with you the parish's financial statements for the fiscal years ended June 30, 2023 and 2024. We have also included the fiscal year 2024-25 budget.

We truly appreciate the continued support you provide to your parish community. Overall, Sunday offertory, Christmas, Easter, Capital Appreciation, and other special collections increased from last year by 11%. Expenses for the church rose 10%, reflecting expenditures related to the renovation of the rectory, church hall, and parish grounds.

As you have been informed previously, the plans for the new parish center renovation were approved by the Diocese. Our general contractor was selected, and proposals were submitted and reviewed for the entire scope of the project. Given our capital campaign has only generated \$968,000 in pledges from 409 families, with \$600,000 being completed, it was decided to complete the project in phases. Phase I renovations will begin September 9th, 2024, and include a new serving area, accessible washrooms, and replacement of the boilers and air handlers in the parish center building. The total cost estimate for Phase I is \$1,250,000. Funds to cover the cost of Phase I are comprised of Capital Campaign payments, along with funds from our parish savings account held at the diocese. Our goal is to complete Phase 2 and 3 renovations in the next 5-7 years.

The parish's overall cash position improved by \$206,000 from the previous year, due to prudent management of our expenses. Parishioners remain very generous in their response to parish collections, as \$80,000 was contributed for Christmas, and \$80,000 for our Capital Appreciation collection, both exceeding budget expectations. The parish food pantry ministry received \$86,800 in donations to continue to serve families in our community. In addition, the Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal (CMAA) remained a very successful endeavor, as the parish realized \$54,000 in rebates from the annual appeal due to the parish once again exceeding its diocesan goal. Overall, the parish is in a healthy financial position due to the continued support of parishioners and proper financial management of the parish assets.

Communication is key to an active and successful parish. We will keep you informed of the financial standing of the parish, and we encourage you to visit our website www.olopdarien.org to stay apprised of the happenings within our ministries. Please consider opportunities to volunteer with a parish ministry; your involvement will help both you and the parish to grow spiritually.
